We are happy to report that the Chairman's Circle – a group of C-Suite business leaders founded 10 years ago to support the Greater Memphis Chamber – has more members than at any time in its history. In 2022, we welcomed 22 new investors to the Chairman's Circle and closed out the year with more than 150 member companies. We expect that number to grow in 2023, as knowledge of our impact on Greater Memphis continues to spread.

Our investment, and yours, fuels the work of the Chamber, allowing it to serve as the voice for business, independent of government funding.

As the top level of membership for the Chamber, the Chairman's Circle was intimately involved in the Chamber's work in 2022. In addition to the 1,078 jobs and \$238.4 million in capital investments we helped recruit to Greater Memphis, we also participated in our three Task Forces in record numbers, using our leadership and influence to advance the region in the following ways:

WORKFORCE TASK FORCE

Task Force members traveled to Orlando to experience a best-in-class accelerated skills program for adults, inventoried the skills we need instructors to teach to our future employees, welcomed high school teachers into their businesses to learn about careers they offer, and provided thousands of eighth graders with a first-of-its-kind interactive regional career fair. Task force members also donated their time, skills, and expertise to lay the foundation for the state's first one-stop accelerated skills training and credentialing center right here in Memphis. That center will give adults industry-tailored credentials in 8-24 weeks in high-demand skill areas. A special thank you goes to Belz Enterprises for donating the building, and to Allworld Project Management, Chris Woods Construction, Cushman & Wakefield, Turner Construction, and LRK.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT TASK FORCE

Task Force members were called upon several times to share insights with site selectors representing out-of-town clients considering moving their companies here. Thank you to members Tom Cleves of Sylvamo, Bill Dunavant III of Dunavant Enterprises, Mike Keeney of Orgill, and John Webb of Cigna for pressing new Tennessee Economic and Community Development Commissioner Stuart McWhorter on ways to make Greater Memphis more competitive.

BUSINESS CLIMATE TASK FORCE

Among other work, task force members brought our regional business priorities to state legislators, the governor, and his cabinet during the Chamber's annual trip to Nashville and then to lawmakers in D.C. in June. They also shared feedback which was used to create the Chamber's Metro Advocacy Agenda.

Thank you to all our investors for their leadership, and a special thanks to our outgoing co-chairs: Ben Adams, Baker Donelson; Jason Berger, Olymbec USA; Chance Carlisle, Carlisle Corporation; Laura Whitsitt, Smith & Nephew (retired); and Kevin Woods, Blue Cross Blue Shield of Tennessee.

Memphis took 10 years to recover from the Great Recession in the late 2000s. As our region began emerging from the pandemic, its business leaders were unified in believing that Memphis could not afford another decade-long recovery. Leaning on its economic research, and with input from its top investors, the Chamber put together **Prosper Memphis 2030**: three bold but attainable goals to transform the region.

THE GOALS OF THE INITIATIVE

As the Chamber continues pressing toward this larger goal of prosperity for all, it laid out three strategic priorities that will govern its work through 2030.

Inclusive jobs

A prosperous city is an inclusive one.

THE GOAL: Create 50,000 high-quality jobs, with half of those jobs going to minorities.

Memphis can only move forward with a robust and educated workforce, building on the talent we already have right here at home.

OUR NEW CHIEF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT OFFICER

Gwyn Fisher, a native Memphian who has played a pivotal role in bringing jobs and investments to West Tennessee for more than a decade, became the Chief Economic Development Officer of the Greater Memphis Chamber in December 2022.

Fisher worked closely with the Chamber on Ford's BlueOval City electric vehicle manufacturing project, the single largest private investment in Tennessee history and in Ford's history.

Gwyn, who holds degrees from Scripps College and the University of Memphis Cecil C. She has also held roles with FedEx Express and IMPACT Memphis, where she served as Executive Director.



Before that, she was a research analyst for the Missouri Economic Research and Information Center (MERIC) at the Missouri Department of Economic Development (DED) for three years. She has a bachelor's degree in political science (2010) and a master's degree in public administration (2013) from Southern Illinois University Carbondale.

Ford Motor Company and the Greater Memphis Chamber are collaborating with entrepreneurs and local communities on a mobility innovation challenge that will fund and pilot new mobility solutions in 2023 and 2024.

Ford's ninth challenge will focus on increasing access to sustainable, electrified mobility options and connecting urban and rural communities throughout the region. Starting in 2023, it will partner with the Chamber, StartCo, and other entities to engage local entrepreneurs in these pilots. The program is similar to Ford Fund's recently announced Accelerator Program with Heartland Alliance in West Tennessee.

This mobility innovation challenge is an opportunity for entrepreneurs to propose equitable mobility solutions for grant funding - typically between \$50,000 and \$150,000 - to be piloted in the Greater Memphis area next year, further accelerating the region as a mobility innovation testbed.

SPOTLIGHT ON:

LEARNING FROM A **LEADING EDUCATOR**

Chairman's Circle investors traveled to Central Florida's Valencia College in January 2022 to examine best practices for adult education skills programs in mechatronics, health sciences, logistics, and construction.


They heard from business leaders involved with the Orlando Economic Partnership about how they transformed a city known primarily for tourism into a city recognized worldwide for economic competitiveness in advanced industries.

The investors also gathered information that will be used here at home to develop more robust training programs in lock step with industry needs.

Valencia began in 1967 as a junior college, and has since broadened to include 130 degree-granting programs, including bachelor's degrees.

59% of Valencia's enrollees are female, 76% are non-white, and the College ranks fifth among American colleges and universities for degrees granted to Hispanic students. Its average salary range of \$42,000-\$48,000 for associate degree recipients is higher than recipients of bachelor's degrees at peer institutions.

TEACHER EXTERNSHIPS

The Greater Memphis Chamber launched its Memphis Teacher Externship Program in 2022. The program, an initiative of the Chairman's Circle, provides teachers with valuable, hands-on experience that they can take back to their classrooms.

Chairman's Circle investors Buckman International, The Juice Plus+ Company, and Methodist Le Bonheur Healthcare hosted the first cohort of teachers.

In addition to stipends, teacher externs will receive a voucher for classroom supplies to help incorporate problem-solving activities in the classroom, potentially improving the learning experience for hundreds of students in the first year alone.

The externship program is closely related to the Chamber's Prosper Memphis 2030 plan, where one of the goals is to graduate 20,000 students with degrees or certifications in STEM fields. Externships will help achieve that and make Memphis a region of choice for new and expanding advanced industry firms – a major source of inclusive, high-quality jobs.


SPOTLIGHT ON:

STATE LEGISLATIVE WINS IN 2022

CHAMPIONED INDUSTRY 4.0 DIPLOMA:

The Greater Memphis Chamber Workforce Development team channeled their education expertise to write a piece of legislation that created an Industry 4.0 Special Diploma that utilizes career and technical education (CTE) credits to prepare high school students for the jobs of the future. The legislation was passed unanimously in both houses and was enacted into law on May 4, 2022.

DEFEATED ANTI-MWBE BILL:

Through a partnership with our peers at the Knoxville Chamber, as well as a larger coalition, the Greater Memphis Chamber helped defeat a bill that would have made it illegal to give preferential treatment to any race, sex, color, ethnicity, or national origin in public contracting – meaning that prioritizing Minority and Women-Owned Business Enterprises (MWBE) in contracting would no longer be possible. This bill was defeated in the Senate. It may come back again in the upcoming session.

ADVOCATING FOR A NEW BRIDGE ACROSS THE MISSISSIPPI RIVER AT MEMPHIS

BRIDGE CLOSURE ANNIVERSARY WEBINAR:

A webinar was held to bring attention back to the need for a new bridge across the Mississippi River at Memphis, a project the Chamber is branding America's River Crossing. The webinar featured transportation engineering expert James Collins (Kimley-Horn), Bill Dunavant III of Dunavant Enterprises, the mayor of West Memphis who was very active during the bridge closure, as well as representatives from TDOT and ARDOT. The webinar brought the bridge back into the public conversation and was a kickoff to efforts to reignite the project.

MEETINGS WITH FEDERAL AND STATE OFFICIALS ON FUNDING OPTIONS:

- Meeting with DOT in D.C. to discuss federal funding options
- New commissioner of TDOT in Memphis to hear local transportation project priorities
- Meeting with TDOT officials to discuss legislation in 2023 around public-private partnership funding options

LOCAL LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES

SHELBY COUNTY MAYORAL FORUM:

A forum was hosted for Shelby County Mayor candidates Incumbent County Mayor Lee Harris and City Councilman Worth Morgan, giving each person the opportunity to answer questions from Chamber investors about priorities for the business community and issues of importance to the business climate of the county.

PUBLIC SAFETY MEETINGS:

In the wake of significant and tragic events in Memphis that made national news, the Chamber convened a series of meetings for investors to hear from the different entities involved in public safety and juvenile justice. This included several newly elected public officials who were able to give clarity around their strategy for the job. Participants included:



The Greater Memphis Chamber relocated its headquarters in summer 2022 to the Tower at Peabody Place in Downtown Memphis. In doing so, we leased 14,515 square feet on the 10th floor from an affiliate of Belz Enterprises. The Chamber last changed offices in 1989, when it became a tenant of the Falls Building.
